

**COUNTY BOARD OF CANVASSERS
SPRING ELECTION
APRIL 4, 2023**

The Ozaukee County Board of Canvass met Monday, April 10, 2023 in Room 118 of the Administration Center for the purpose of canvassing the April 4, 2023 Spring Election.

Meeting called to order at 8:00 am.

Present: County Clerk Winkelhorst, Patti Spencer, Carol Boettcher and Chief Deputy County Clerk Henning.

County Clerk Winkelhorst reviewed the steps taken to prepare for the County Board of Canvassers. The Board of Canvass accepted the information.

There were no provisional ballots cast in Ozaukee County.

The following are the findings, by reporting unit, of the Board upon review of the election results.

The discrepancy between ballots cast and the voter list is due to a Badger Books issue. One (1) voter was issued a second voter number; therefore, 1 more voter number was issued than ballots cast. The duplicate number is 842.

Ward 2:

ICE - 761 Voter List – 763

The discrepancy between ballots cast and the voter list is due to a Badger Books issue. One (1) voter was issued four (4) voter numbers; therefore, 3 more voter numbers than ballots cast which equals 760 voters. The duplicate numbers are 720-722.

One (1) voter from Ward 7 was issued a Ward 2 ballot in error.

Ward 3:

ICE - 754 Voter List – 756

The discrepancy between ballots cast and the voter list is due to a Badger Books issue. Two (2) voters were issued a second voter number; therefore, 2 more voter numbers were issued than ballots cast. The duplicate numbers are 527 and 678.

The discrepancy between ballots cast and the voter list is due to a Badger Books issue. One (1) voter was issued a second voter number; therefore, one (1) more voter number was issued than ballots cast. The duplicate number is 18.

One (1) voter from Ward 6 was issued a Ward 5 ballot in error. The total number of ballots for both reporting units equals 1570. The total number of voters for both reporting units equals 1570.

Ward 6:

ICE - 868 Voter List – 872

The discrepancy between ballots cast and the voter list is due to a Badger Books issue. Three (3) voters were issued a second voter number; therefore, 3 more voter numbers were issued than ballots cast. The duplicate numbers are 23, 363 and 794.

One (1) voter was issued a Ward 5 ballot in error. The total number of ballots for both reporting units equals 1570. The total number of voters for both reporting units equals 1570.

City of Cedarburg:

Ward 7:

ICE - 843 Voter List – 849

The discrepancy between ballots cast and the voter list is due to a Badger Books issue. One (1) voter was issued four (4) voter numbers and one (1) voter was issued two (2) voter numbers; therefore, 4 more voter numbers than ballots cast which equals 845 voters. The duplicate numbers are 267, 268, 269 and 270.

One (1) voter was issued a Ward 2 ballot in error and one (1) voter left without casting their ballot.

The City of Cedarburg has one (1) polling place for its seven (7) wards. The total number of ballots cast equals 5,612 and the total number of voters equals 5,613. The difference is due to one voter in Ward 7 that did not cast their ballot.
